The Cole5H17 file contains many unrelated (i.e. the relationship includes many persons only related by marriage) Cole persons who lived near Bedford, Beds., Eng. They are related by marriage in a very circuitous manner. Their oldest Cole ancestor has an alias name with the word "unrelated" in it.

Up to this version, nicknames and french-canadian DIT names were suffixed (using a semicolon) to the main given name. This caused lookups for given names to fail. So all such nicknames and DIT names have been separated from the given names using a space. These nicknames and DIT names were also enclosed in normal parentheses so that they could be distinguished from the actual given names.

A copy of the Cole5H17.ged file was stored in my "never deleted" GMAIL storage area.

The GEDCOM file named Cole5H17.GED was editted before it was stored on the hard drive in the "Perennial" shipping folder. The source in each of the Notes was editted to be cole5H17.GED. Each had facts in multiple sources for either the individual or for the marriage.

The folder where the new file will be placed should be an "FTM" folder. Every effort will be made to correct the concatenated words that occurred years ago. Before retirement, Vic Cole was a businessman, alderman and citizen of Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, Canada. As a child, Vic suffered from asthma, often being bedridden. Art WOOLGAR began living with the Cole family when Vic was in public school. See the notes for Vic's mother Florence KINGSLAND for more information about Art WOOLGAR. Art was 6 years older than Vic and was like Vic's friendly big brother. Vic's nickname for Art was "Doc" because he preferred to have Art give him adrenalin injections to check his asthma. (Eventually, his asthma was controlled by special drugs developed in the latter part of the twentieth century.) Vic attended Prince Arthur public school and then Moose Jaw Technical Collegiate (now known as Peacock), where he first met Earl NANT. In 1936, his friend, Earl Nant, and then Vic began their business careers working for Mr. A. MacGill at Great West Battery at 48 High Street E in Moose Jaw. Shortly after graduating from high school, Vic's boss, Mr. A. MacGill, suggested to Mr Hal Berry that Vic would be a good employee at the electrical power station (owned by Moose Jaw Light and Power), so Vic changed jobs.

But Vic decided to learn about airplanes, certainly the most interesting technology of that era. So Vic went to California to study airplane instruments at the American School of Aircraft Instruments in Glendale, May to October 1941. This was just after the Great Depression, so Vic didn't even have enough money to pay for his meals on Sundays. (His mother arranged for some spinsters in California to look after him every Sunday.) Upon graduation, he worked at Ferry Command in Montreal during the second World War. It was in Montreal, in 1941, that he met his future wife: Marion GOATCHER. They were married in Montreal, QC in 1942. Marion's parents and Vic's mother travelled to Montreal to attend the wedding. The five of them went to Niagra Falls together (on Vic and Marion's honeymoon), probably because none of them had ever been to Niagra Falls before. A photo of them on the "Maid of the Mist" documents this.

Vic and Marion began their married life in Montreal in 1943, where their first child, David, was born. After the war, they moved to Argentina, where Vic helped set up a new Argentine airline. Around this time, the unrest around PERON became more and more dangerous. At the end of their 2 year contract, they decided to leave Argentina. Vic and Marion returned to Montreal and went to Noranda, QC for a short visit with Marion's mother, Daisy, and Marion's younger sister, Doris. Then they moved to Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan to join Vic's life-long friend and business partner, Earl NANT. Vic's parents were still living in Moose Jaw at that time. Vic, Marion and David moved into the family home at 1027 Ominica St. E, where Vic had grown up. His parents had moved downtown to be closer to Zion church where Vic's father, Charley, was the caretaker.

In their early business life, Vic and Earl owned and managed the Great West Auto Electric, an automotive parts and service store. They also invested in other start-up business ventures such as television set sales. In Moose Jaw, Vic and Marion's family grew to include Charles (Chuck) COLE and Christine (nTe COLE) WARD. Vic's non-business activities included weekends at Buffalo Lake and membership in various local service clubs such as the Kinsmen, Rotary and Shriners Club. The NANT family (Earl and Olive) and the COLE family (Vic and Marion) owned neighboring cottages on the north shore of Buffalo Pound Lake. They enjoyed many years of happiness with their many friends in and around Moose Jaw. For a number of years, Vic served as a Moose Jaw alderman taking special interest in the expansion of Moose Jaw's industrial businesses. When someone was needed to manage their newly acquired bowling alley business, Vic and Earl decided that Vic would manage their Moose Jaw Bowling Center. Earl NANT and his son, Ed, would continue to operate their Great West Auto Electric business. Eventually Ed NANT became the primary owner of the Great West and Chuck COLE became the primary owner of the bowling alley.

During the middle and more recent part of his life, Vic suffered a few accidents, a heart attack in 1970, cancer and numerous eye-related problems. Nevertheless, Vic continues to enjoy life to the fullest. Vic and Earl were successful enough to be able to easily retire in their late 50's, while they could still travel and have fun. After retirement, Vic and Marion (and Earl and Olive) spent their summers in the Moose Jaw area and their winters in Mesa, Arizona. In Mesa, Vic and Marion soon made new friends with couples from all over the northern states of the USA and Canada.

When Earl NANT died, Vic deeply missed his best friend with whom he had been all his life, ever since their high school days. During retirement, Vic actively manages his financial investment portfolio and has helped a small number of other close friends with theirs. Marion suffered a debilitating stroke around the turn of the century. Through physio-therapy and endless hours of practice, Marion was able to regain much of her mobility. But she and Vic were forced to curtail their winter vacations in Mesa, Arizona. Their many friends helped Vic and Marion cope with their illnesses, mostly by being there to visit with them.

In the late summer of 2002, Vic and Marion travelled back to Montreal, where their first great-grandson, George VAVOUGIOS had been born (on June 08, 2002). George's mother is Theresa COLE, Vic and Marion's eldest granddaughter. George's father is Tommy VAVOUGIOS, who was born in Montreal, QC of Greek descent.

In 2003, Vic and Marion celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary in Moose Jaw. Approximately 150 people, all friends or family, joined them for a reception and supper on the first Saturday after their wedding anniversary. Vic's sister Gladys (nee COLE) PAUL attended the anniversary. Marion's sisters (Doris NORTH and Hazel HIBBARD) and Marion's brother Jim GOATCHER also came to the wedding anniversary. So many of their friends attended that it was more like a big reunion or a wedding rather than a wedding anniversary reception.

In autumn 2004, Vic and Marion moved from their 50 year-old house on Henry Street in Moose Jaw to a nearby retirement home on Mulberry Lane, also in Moose Jaw. They enjoy a 2 bedroom apartment and join the other residents for meals in the dining hall. They are on the ground floor and have a private entrance. Their phone number and email addresses remain unchanged. Vic and Marion's youngest children, Chuck and Christine, still visit them very often. Vic has recovered from a recently broken ankle. Whenever they are able, Marion and Vic take trips to visit their friends, in Moose Jaw, elsewhere in Saskatchewan or in the neighbouring states and provinces. In 2004 they both travelled to Ontario to visit their son David, his wife Yvette, their 2 grandchildren and their 3 great-grandchildren. In 2004 they also took a multi-day trip by car to visit friends in Alberta.

Marion Goatcher was born in 1922 in Regina, during the years that her parents were living in western Canada, in Saskatchewan and Alberta. During harvesting season, her father, Philip, worked on a thrashing gang. This was a travelling gang and the whole family followed. One year, while they were away from home in Regina, someone stole a whole wall of their house at 456 Forget street. This disappointment was probably one of the factors entering into their decision to return to Montreal, Quebec. In Montreal, Marion attended Earl Grey public school and then Fairmount public school. After many years in Montreal, Marion's parents took up a homestead in Farmborough, Quebec, on the south-eastern outskirts of Noranda, Quebec. Marion remained in Montreal to finish her last years of high school at Montreal High, while her parents were homesteading at Farmborough.

Marion visited her parents at Farmborough, near Noranda, each summer. After finishing high school, Marion taught in a one-room school house near Farmborough. During World War II, Marion returned to Montreal where she worked as a draftsman, revising engineering drawings. That is when she met and married Vic COLE who was in Montreal working as an aviation instrument technician at Ferry Command in Dorval, QC. Shortly after the end of World War II, they moved to Argentina for a couple of years to assist in the start-up of the first national Argentine airline. The unrest around Peron prompted them to return to Canada. They decided to return to Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, Vic's home town, where Vic had been investing in an automotive parts retail store named the Great West Auto Electric. They raised their three children in Moose Jaw, where Vic became an municipal alderman.

Upon retirement until around the year 2000, Marion and Vic began to spend each winter as "snowbirds" in Mesa, Arizona. There, Marion painted many oil paintings, mostly of different landscapes from around the world. In 2000, Marion suffered a stroke which left her with partial use of the right side of her body. After endless hours of physical therapy, Marion relearned how to write (e.g. letters to friends and relatives) and how to walk with a walker. In time, she also was able to prepare meals by herself and renew her driver's license. After the year 2000, Marion and Vic stopped wintering in Mesa and stayed at their home in Moose Jaw, making short trips by car to visit their many friends.

Charlie's first home, Water End House, is located a few miles east of Wheathamstead, where a small bridge permits the ancient Roman road to cross the river Lea. In earlier days before the bridge was built, travellers along the Roman road would ford across the river at this location. A picture of Water End house can be seen at one of the author's web sites at "http://ephotocaption.com/a/35/35.html". Other photos and more of the history of Water End Farm can be found at

Water End House has been maintained in very good condition until at least the 1990's when the author last visited it. The census of 1881 lists his father, James COLE, but does not list Charles, indicating that he was born after 1881. The census of 1885 shows that the infant Charlie, his parents and the rest of their family were living in Water End House in Sandridge. One day, by accident, Charles was severely burned inside Water End House near one of the fireplaces. One side of his face was noticeably scarred and one ear was burned almost completely off. He could still hear well with the disfigured ear. However, in time, he became quite deaf in the other ear.

In the census of 1885, Charles COLE is shown to be living at Water End Farm near Sandridge, Hertford, England. Herbert BRIMLEY, a childhood friend of Charlie's is also mentioned in this census [1885]. Herbert's father, William BRIMLEY (1842-1899) was employed by Charlie's father, James COLE at Water End farm. A neighbor, Willm BRIMBY, age 32, is listed in the 1881 census, but this is probably a different person although the pronunciation of the two surnames is very similar.

Charles was born at Water End House in Sandridge, Hertford, England near Wheathampstead. Charles left Wheathampstead, England (a few miles north of St. Albans) in 1906 to emigrate to Canada where he settled in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan. He was the janitor of the Zion United Church in Moose Jaw from 1908 to 1958. Charles' brother, William "Will" COLE had married Jeannette "Nett" DOWSON. Will and Jeannette and Charles had a very good childhood friend named Florence KINGSLAND who married Herbert Edward JOHNSON in 1904. This marriage failed and Florence emigrated to Canada in 1913 to find Charles COLE. Charles COLE and Florence KINGSLAND were soon married [c1913] and lived in a home in Moose Jaw at 1027 Ominica St. E. where both their children, Gladys (b.1914) and Victor (b.1918), were born. When Vic was a child, his parents invited an orphan of their neighbors on the west, Arthur Noel "Art" WOOLGAR. to live with them. For the six years that Art lived with them, Vic learned much from Art, who was like his older brother and shared a bedroom with Vic. Art was indeed 6 years older than Vic and spent a lot of time with Vic who was often bedridden with asthma. When Vic needed an adrenalin injection, he would ask Art to do it. So Vic's nickname for Art was "Doc".

After Vic and Glad had moved out of the house, Charlie and Florence moved into a rented second story apartment on Main Street just south of Zion Church where Charlie was the caretaker from 1908 to 1958. To return home from Zion Church along Main Stree, Charley would walk south past the Grant Hall hotel, across Cordova street and enter the building on the second lot south of Cordova. The Temple Gardens dance hall (now demolished) was across the alley east of their apartment. Eventually only an empty lot separated them from the Grant Hall hotel. Much later, Temple Gardens and the north portion of this entire block gave way to a new Sears store and some other stores including Father and Son (owned by Jack FREIDIN who lived next door to Victor Cole who lived at 943 Henry St.).

Charlie never lost his Cockney accent all the time he lived in Canada. When Charlie and Florence moved downtown from Ominica street, they didn't sell their house on Ominica street, in the "East End" of Moose Jaw, but rented it out instead. They also owned another house at 777 Hochelaga St., a few blocks north of Caribou St. and 4th Ave E. For years, they rented this house to Eddy PAUL. Eddy's brother, Albert (Alb) PAUL, was married to Gladys COLE. Eddy PAUL, and his family rented the house during the 1950's before moving to Alberta.

Many years later, in the early 1950's, when the downtown apartment (occupied by Charles and Florence) was demolished to make way for the new Sear's store, Charlie and Florence moved into a street-level apartment at 443 Main St. N. located just two doors north of Zion Church. This is where they lived until Charlie died.

After marrying Albert PAUL, a printer, who was also from Moose Jaw, Gladys COLE moved with him to Mimico, a western suburb of Toronto, Ontario, Canada, where they raised their family (Keith PAUL and Donald PAUL). Mimico is now part of Etobicoke.

In the early years of the second world war, Vic went to study airplane instrumentation in California, then moved to Montreal, Quebec where he worked at Ferry Command until the end of the war. It was in Montreal where he met and married Marion GOATCHER in 1943. During this time, their first child, David, was born in Montreal. While in Montreal, Vic was in a terrible car accident, that broke many of his bones. After the war, Vic moved his family to Argentina for a few years. In Argentina, Vic and some others from Ferry Command, assisted in the creation of the first national Argentine airline. While there, Vic was responsible for aircraft Instrument maintenance. When civil agitation against the Argentine government (ie against President Peron) was breaking out, Vic returned to Moose Jaw. This was around 1948. He and his wife, Marion, (and son, David) moved into the house on Ominica street in Moose Jaw, where Vic had been born.

During all this time, Vic's father, Charley, continued to work as caretaker of Zion church (formerly a Methodist church but now a United Church) in downtown Moose Jaw. In his spare time, while he was caretaker of Zion Church, Charley worked part time as the gardener at Mr. (Edward?) HOPKIN's house (65 Athabasca St. W in 1921) and at Mr. BELLAMY's house (perhaps on Langdon Crescent), both located in the downtown core of Moose Jaw. In the late 20th century, the Hopkin's house became a fine restaurant in downtown Moose Jaw. After 1945, Charley never returned to visit relatives in England. Charley's wife, Florence, and her two young children visited relatives in England in 1920. They did keep in touch by mail with Charley's nephew, Leslie COLE and Florence's sisters, Gladys (Doll) and Ethyl, who lived in England all their lives. Charley died of cancer of the bladder and was buried in the Moose Jaw Rosedale cemetery. This cemetery can be found near the 1500 block of Caribou Street W. Upon her death in Toronto, Ontario, nine years later, Charley's wife, Florence, was buried beside him. Their son Vic (and his wife Marion) were eventually buried in the same plot.

Charles Percy Cole was janitor (caretaker) of Zion church in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan for many years, perhaps 50 years. He also worked part-time for the very influencial Hopkins and Bellamy families who lived in downtown Moose Jaw. These families were significant members of Zion church. We believe that these part-time jobs were a way for the Hopkins and Bellamy families to supplement the meagre salary paid to Charles by the church. I (David, grandson of Charles) recall accompanying Charles to Hopkins house where he did some gardening. My brother Chuck recalls hearing the following story.

A new minister was assigned to Zion church. For some unknown reason, this new minister was considering replacing Charles with someone else, probably during the depression years. When Mrs Bellamy (nee Hopkins) heard this, she visited the new minister to discuss the dismissal of Charles Cole. She made her opposition known and suggested that the new minister should speak to the church treasurer to see how much money her family contributed to the church. As a result, the new minister decided to not replace Charles.

VARIOUS GUY FAWKES DAY CHANTS

One day, many years ago, I asked my grandfather, Charles Percy COLE, if they celebrated Hallowe'en in England. His

reply was that there was a similar celebration on the fifth of November. The children would go around to their neighbors' houses asking for candies, fruit or pennies. This occasion was called Guy Fawkes' Day. At each door, he and his friends would chant:

Guy Fawkes Day Chant #1

Remember, Remember, the fifth of November

.....

Guy, guy, guy!

Stick him up on high;

....

If you don't give me one, I'll take two

The better for me and the worse for you!

• • • • •

Apparently, many other Guy Fawkes Day Chants were also used.

Remember, remember, the fifth of November, Gunpowder, treason and plot!
A stick or a stake for King James' sake

The Legend

Guy Fawkes was a man who planted a bomb in the basement of the House of Lords in London. Fortunately, the plot was discovered and no explosion occured. The date was November 5, 1605. The following notes more fully describe this occasion.

The Famous Gunpowder Plot

November 5th marks the anniversary of the Gunpowder Plot, a conspiracy to blow up the English Parliament and King James I in 1605. On that day, the king prepared to open Parliament.

Uprising of English Catholics

It was intended to be the beginning of a great uprising of English Catholics, who were distressed by the increased severity of penal laws against the practice of their religion. The conspirators, who began plotting early in 1604, expanded their number to a point where secrecy was impossible. The group included Robert Catesby, John Wright, and Thomas Winter, the originators, Christopher Wright, Robert Winter, Robert Keyes, Guy Fawkes, a soldier who had been serving in Flanders, Thomas Percy, John Grant, Sir Everard Digby, Francis Tresham, Ambrose Rookwood, and Thomas Bates.

Brought to Light by Anonymous Letter.

Percy hired a cellar under the House of Lords, in which 36 barrels of gunpowder, overlaid with iron bars and firewood, were secretly stored. The conspiracy was brought to light through a mysterious letter received by Lord Monteagle, a

brother-in-law of Tresham, on October 26, urging him not to attend Parliament on the opening day. The 1st earl of Salisbury and others, to whom the plot was made known, took steps leading to the discovery of the materials and the arrest of Fawkes as he entered the cellar. Other conspirators, overtaken in flight or seized afterward, were killed outright, imprisoned, or executed.

Fireworks, Bonfires in England

Among those executed was Henry Garnett, the superior of the English Jesuits, who had known of the conspiracy. While the plot was the work of a small number of men, it provoked hostility against all English Catholics and led to an increase in the harshness of laws against them. Guy Fawkes Day, November 5, is still celebrated in England with fireworks and bonfires, on which effigies of the conspirator are burned.

After the death of his father, when his mother found that she couldn't afford to raise her family, Philip Richard GOATCHER was sent to Canada to be raised by his aunt, Hanna Mary [nTe] GOULTON, and his uncle, Charles DRAKE. Philip was 7 years old when he arrived in Canada. The ship's log shows him to be 8 years old, but his age was probably exaggerated so that the ship would allow him aboard.

Immediately after his marriage to Daisy nTe SULLIVAN in 1912, they overnighted in Montreal for one night, then took the train to Regina, Saskatchewan to begin their married life together.

They stayed in Regina for over 5 years, moved back to Quebec, homesteaded in Alberta and returned to Regina around 1922. They were living in Regina [for the second time] between 1922 and 1927 and after 1927 for many more years. Henderson's Regina Directory 1927 cites "Goatcherd(sic) Phillip [should be Philip] R emp C N R h 456 Forget (N. Regina). They returned to Montreal during the great depression of the 1930's. Autobiography - Daisy (n e SULLIVAN GOATCHER (1884-1970) [notations by David KC COLE are in square braces]

[The original autobiography is stored in the archives of David KC COLE with the title "AutoBio_DSullivan.txt"]

My earliest recollections were when my mother died when I was nearly nine years old. I had a half-brother who was three when my mother died. My stepfather [Mr. Tom TAMPLING] was a cab owner and driver. He used to leave us at home when he was driving his cab. I used to have to take Tom [my half- brother] to school and then give him something to eat at noon and at supper time. It mostly was bread and what we call[ed] dripping, which was fat from the roast of meat that we had each Sunday, when my father cooked it for us. I know he used to cook a meal for us during the week but we chiefly lived on bread and dripping.

After a few months he took us to live at Bandley Heath [probably Blindly Heath, St John, Surry, England] with his

bed-ridden sister [Emma nee Mitchell CHAPMAN] who had a daughter who lived with her and took care of her. I or rather we had a mile to walk to school, we took our lunch, and I remember my [half-]brother did not like the currant turnovers, so he gave me his as well as my own.

When I was 14 years old my dad [my stepfather, Mr. Tom TAMPLING] came and took us back to London, he had married again [To Alice Emily nee TAYLOR] and there was a little girl [Rose Elizabeth TAYLOR] and a boy [John TAMPLING]. My stepmother [Alice] and I did not get along well, so I went to service, coming home to visit occasionally. One time, a cousin [Jack CHAPMAN] from Canada came to visit us and I met him and he suggested I go to Canada. So I saved my money ready to go. Then I had to have an operation in hospital and when I was out again, my stepmother [Alice nee TAYLOR] had to go in [to the hospital] and I went home and looked after the home and spent the money I had saved, on the home [expenses].

When she [Alice nee TAYLOR] was home again I went to work again, but my cousin [Jack CHAPMAN] in Canada offered to pay my fare, so I accepted and it was 30 dollars steerage. [It] took a week to come over on the boat to [the province of] Quebec. I was told to get on the train to Montreal[, QC] and they took us to an office for employing servants. I told them I was going to my cousin's [home] at Iron Hill. The man said if I ever needed work to let him know. So then I went on the train to Iron Hill (West Sheffield) the name of the station [in the Eastern Townships, near Cowansville, QC]. When I got off the train I couldn't help thinking how lovely the place seemed. I had lived in London[, England] so much [of my life]. There were mountains around us [in West Sheffield]. My cousin was not there to meet me, but a young lad who took the mail from the train offered to take me to my cousin, Mr. J. CHAPMAN. Well it was getting dark when we arrived and I was sure scared the light would go out before we got there, as I could see the log cabin a long time before we got to the door. Anyway when we got there my cousin Emily [nee CLARK CHAPMAN] was up cooking. I believe the boys were all in bed, she had 4 boys from 14 yrs [years]. down to 6 yrs [years]. They got up and were very interested in this girl cousin who had come from England.

[Editor's Note: The word-of-mouth information that the GOATCHER's provided to me (David Cole) was the following: Emily TAMPLING was the daughter of Tom TAMPLING. Emily's mother was Rose, the second wife of Tom TAMPLING. Emily was 'almost' a step-sister of Daisy's, because her father was Daisy's stepfather. Jack CHAPMAN was married to Emily TAMPLING, so he is also not a proper cousin of Daisy's.' I believed that Emily was a niece of Daisy's stepfather, Tom TAMPLING. My research indicated that Jack and Emily CHAPMAN were recorded in the 1901 Canada census. In 2018, I discovered the Tampling Family Tree information at Ancestry which explained everything. I created the Tampling Tree (a diagram) named TamplingTree_F.jpg which I attached as a memory document to Thomas TAMPLING (1857-1939) [FSID:L2Z8-S2T] at FamilySearch.org. I discovered the following: Tom TAMPLING, Daisy's stepfather, briefly had a second wife named Edith PORTER, whom he divorced after about 1 year. They had a daughter named Caroline TAMPLING who probably stayed with her mother after the divorce. Rose is the name of the illigitimate daughter of Alice Emily TAYLOR, the third wife of Tom TAMPLING. Rose was not the name of any wife of Tom TAMPLING. Jack CHAPMAN's second wife was Caroline TAMPLING, the daughter of Tom TAMPLING and his second wife.]

I [Daisy nee SULLIVAN] got work at a summer boarding house at a lakeside. Then after the season was over, one day, at my cousins log cabin, a two seated buggy (I forget what they really called them in those days). It took two horses to pull it. Well, a lady came from Cowansville to see if I would come and work for her. I had promised another lady I would go and see her the day we went to the fair. Mrs. Cotton offered me 3 1/2 dollars a week. So after I had seen the first lady and told her Mrs. Cotton had offered me 3 1/2 dollars, she said "Oh! I couldn't possibly give as much as that [. I could give you] only 2.00 a week." So in the end I went to Mrs. Cotton's and stayed there [in Mississiquoi near Cowansville, QC] till I got married, 3 years later. [Mrs Cotton was the wife of Dr. Cotton.] I was married August 15th 1912 in my cousins' [Jack CHAPMAN's] parlour, and in the evening we took the train from Cowansville [QC] to Montreal [QC, Canada] where we stayed at a friend's home overnight.

The next day we took the Harvester Excursion to Regina [,SK] (\$12.00 return if we worked for 3 months) where my husband expected to get [work] on the C.P.R. and he did [but it was at the C.N.R.]. But it was such low wages for a wiper [i.e. an engine wiper], 15 cents an hour in the roundhouse, which we found we could not live on. I meanwhile had gotten day work \$5.00 a week. So as we were using up our bit of savings to live on. Philip quit the railroad and went out on the prairie stooking [wheat into sheaves] at \$3.00 a day. I meanwhile was feeling very sick so asked him to come back, which he did and I had to quit working as our first little girl [,Margaret] was on its way. He got work at

one place and another. One place he worked at, the man asked him how a young man like he was out of work. So he told him and when he was through with that foreman, he got on working at a lumber company for \$65.00 a month. Our little girl was born June 12, 1913. We had built a new little shack as our old one was so cold [.] [and] I came from the hospital with Margaret to it. It was only two rooms but so much warmer than the old four roomed shack we had been living in. Soon after Margaret was born, Philip's uncle [Charles DRAKE] and aunt wrote to us asking us to go back East and [asked] Philip to run the farm as uncle was sick. So we said "Yes we would if they sent us the fare" which they did. Margaret was walking by this time, but when we got back Aunt Mary [the wife of Charles DRAKE] was so disappointed that I was again expecting as she thought I would be able to help on the farm. After Hazel was born, uncle decided to sell the farm and when he did Philip got work on a farm at \$30.00 a month with rooms for us to live in. After a while Philip decided to go back west and borrowed the money for our transportation from a gentleman farmer as uncle [Charles DRAKE] would not lend us the fare.

We got back west and worked for a farmer [named Fred] at Hodgeville [, Saskatchewan] for a year at \$300.00 per year. At the end of that year another young farmer asked us to work for him at \$500.00 per year, which we did. He used to go off for trips leaving Philip to run the farm. At harvesting time when the threshers came we had to feed them while on the place: 5 meals a day. Practically, breakfast at 5:30 am Lunch at 10:00 am Dinner at 12:00 Lunch at 3:00 pm Supper at 6:00 pm. I had to bake all the bread, pies, cook meat and vegetables and make cakes also make sandwiches and cakes for lunches for 16 men. It sure was a busy time but the three brothers used to help me with the dishes. We were expecting our fourth child [, Arthur,] at this time, so it was sure a trying spell.

We stayed with Fred a year and then Philip thought he would like to go and homestead. So we read, in a paper, of land to be had in Alberta, So Philip decided we would go to Rocky Mountain House but found when we got there, the land within 60 miles of a railroad was being held for soldiers. So Philip heard, from a man in the hotel, of a farm to be sold so he went out to see it. It was within 12 miles of the town, so he decided we'd buy it, putting down what cash we had and paying \$50.00 a month till only the mortgage was owing. We put down the \$100.00 and then bought a cookstove, a few dishes and groceries. I asked Philip about beds, chairs, table, he said "Oh! we'll make bunk beds" [, and that] there was some straw in the barn that we could make mattresses of. So I bought some unbleached cotton and made two mattress covers to put the straw in, while in the hotel. Then when the papers were all signed, Philip hired a buggy and horse and took us out the 15 miles. We had quite a time getting there, as it was in April and the roads were bad, quite a bit was cordroyed and the water would come up over the top when we went over. Anyway at last we got there, my eldest little girl [, Margie,] was very concerned. "Were we ever going to get there?" It was a nice little house 3 rooms. Philip made a room upstairs after a while for the children. After Philip had got a little wood ready for me, he left me there with the three children under 6 years [old]. A neighbour told me I would have to watch the children as coyotes might come after them. So I used to spend a lot of time watching out of the door or window to see they were safe. It was dreadfully lonesome as I couldn't see a house at all, the nearest one was about 15 minutes walk away. Philip got work on a farm south, near Calgary [AB], at \$65.00 a month. He used to send \$50.00 to the farm agents and then keep a few dollars for his laundry, then send about \$11.00. We lived very carefully, used to get one quart of milk from the next farmer. Philip had brought a dozen hens before he left us so we would have a few eggs to eat. They were Black Minncas and they sure did lay but would not set, so I exchanged two of them with the farmer for Red Hens which were wanting to set. Well they set all right but when the little chicks arrived the mothers were so alive with lice that the poor little chicks just died.

Philip used to come home once in a while. I remember the first time he came home, he knocked on the door to surprise me, well when I opened the door and saw him I just tumbled into his arms and cried. I was so happy to see him. It was quite lonesome when he was gone so far away. Well we got along pretty well. One time when Philip came to visit, he showed me how to use the shot-gun. I sure was scared, but he said "Well, if you did not have any eggs and you could shoot, you might get a Spruce Hen."Which I did but not the first shot. I did not like the taste of the Spruce Hen, but we all thought it better than no meat. You see we had no means of getting meat, just eggs we had mostly, unless we had someone get us a little meat from town. We did not have much money only about \$11.00 for the whole month, and there were 4 of us to feed. We picked blueberries right near the house. I think I canned 100 quarts which we used in the winter for desserts. In the fall Philip came home and decided to cut trees and have a man hew ties which the railroad was paying 25 cents each. He had brought home a wagon and two horses which were not very good and were quite a trouble to Philip. Anyway he also brought home a pair of doe rabbits so we could raise rabbits. Which we did, but a disease took the baby rabbits and they all died. Philip used to take two loads of ties a day but what with paying the man and boarding him we did not make any money. Philip in the spring cleared more land and in the fall of that

year we heard of a farmer who was having a sawmill and the farmers were to bring their logs and get paid in the fall. Philip thought it was a good project. So he got out logs, hauled them to the saw mill and was told to put his logs in a certain pile. Well whenever anyone came to the saw mill the owners would just go and take a log wherever the right size was. Which ended that when the time of paying was up there were no accounts kept and Philip found according to the saw mill owner he was owning him \$60.00. So Philip was so disgusted that he decided to sell his stock but he couldn't sell the horses. So he let them roam wild and we went back to Regina North, Saskatchewan.

When we got there our house had all broken down. The back part had all been pulled apart and it was open to the elements. We rented a little two room house for a month. Philip got work on the railroad. When we were coming out of the railway station a man called to Philip and it was his brother William [William Noel GOATCHER]. He helped us to find a house and also helped us carry our luggage down the railroad track about 1 1/2 miles. I used to go to auction sales to buy bits of furniture. Margaret and Hazel were going to school, but not till we had built up the back wall of the shack as we called them in those days. We stayed there till Philip was eligible to get free transportation for us all back east.

We then took the trip, 5 children and ourselves. [Daisy had exactly 5 children including Doris only after 1924.] When we visited Philip's mother, [SARAH Jane GOULTON, in Montreal], a friend of theirs suggested Philip stay and he would get him on a dairy route. Which he did. His mother loaned him \$50.00 and we had \$50.00 of our own to put down on a bond, and he had to make it up too \$200.00 out of his weekly wages. He worked for the milk company, I think, 3 years. This was in the years of '31 to '35, when there was a lot of unemployed and one day the owner of the milk company called him into the office and asked him what he was going to do about the [customers'] back debts on the books. Philip said "I have just done what you told me, the customers paid for the milk they bought and about 25 cents a week off the back debts." Well, being as he would not let his bond money go against the debts, they told him they did not need him any more. The French Canadians that were working for the company, I believe, gave in their bond money.

Philip did not get any work for 3 years. We lived on the \$200.00 bond money and about the time when things were really desperate, I used to work out by the day, he came home and asked me how would I like to go homesteading. The government were putting men on land near Noranda, who were building houses log and frame. So when I found I could take my furniture I said I'd go. So about September Philip went with some other men up to the land and I was left with the family till our house was built. I hated having to go and get the relief money each week. I remember the first week they deducted the money for Philip and the next week they deducted more and when I asked them why, they sent me away across Montreal, and when I asked them they said "You have a daughter working bringing in \$10.00 per month." It all seemed so unreasonable. Anyway about the middle of December I went down to see if there was any word about us getting to Noranda before Christmas, and the agent said "How many are going?" I said "3 of us." So I then asked him when we would be going. He said "Oh about Sunday or Monday AM." This was on a Thursday and I had a six room house to pack. But I never said a word. I was so glad to be getting off relief. My eldest girl's boyfriend and my son Jim helped me pack. He was for throwing out my old collections of things that one collects thru the years. We got packed and the youngest about 10 years got a kitten to take with us.

I can't seem to remember about how we got on the train, but I do remember we had the kitten in a box but it got out as soon as we started. There were all kinds of cats and dogs on the train and you can imagine the smell and the fights of them on the train. Well we got there the next day, and then the government had sleighs to take us out to the land. That was on the 18th of December 1935. [In 1935, Daisy was 56 years old and Philip was 51.] We slept on the floor on mattresses of course, but the stairs leading upstairs were not made. Yet there were 3 rooms upstairs and 3 down. Philip and I in the spring made a cellar, he dug the soil and I carried it to put around trees in the front of the house. They are still there. [One tree was still there c1997.] I believe everyone envied us our trees as most of the places were cut down all around the house. We were able to get a bit tidy by Christmas Day. One of the neighbours had a party and invited us but it was quite a rowdy party and the men had somehow got liquor and would pass out, we did not stay very long. We started clearing as soon as the snow started to melt. Daily, Philip went working on building houses, then the roads had to be made, it was just like a trail when we first went there. We wore rubber boots the first year or so, as water used to lay on the footpaths. I never got to town as I could not walk far. Most elderly people used to stay on the land and the husbands go into town. As soon as the river thawed they used to go by boat which was much easier than walking 15 miles to town. The highway was not built for many years. When we first arrived, the government supplied us with groceries and some meat but after a few months when we got paid for our work done

[at] 22 1/2 cents an hour, we bought our own. Our first year of planting a garden was a complete failure. I guess as the land had not been opened up. The growing season was always very short. The river did not thaw out till into April and of course the ground was just as slow. Our carrots were very small and potatoes froze sometimes 3 times before the frosts were over. The next year was a little better. Some more settlers came, things were some better and the government had different plans for them. The roads were getting better all the time. Many horses died on the hard work of making the roads. No machinery like is used nowadays. Some settlers just pulled out especially if they had never been on a farm and had to bake their own bread.

My son who had wanted to see the north country had come from high school with us, he tried to get work and did help on building the railroad bridge, but when that was finished, that was all he could get to do. Till one summer the Anglican minister asked Philip if I would go into Noranda and look after 3 men while the wife went on a holiday. So I walked 4miles to phone the lady and she asked me if I would work for her for 15.00 a month. I said it would not pay me to leave my home less than 25.00. In the end she agreed to pay me the 25.00 with which we put in some flour for the winter. It was while I was there the master asked about my family etc. He suggested [that my son] Jim could perhaps get into Noranda Mines as an apprentice. So when I got home I told Jim and he went to the mine, which is a big gold mine. He filled out papers and was told they would let him know. A year went by and one day he came home from the post office with a letter asking him to report. Well they took him on at 35 cents an hour. But he also got an I.C.S. course which was a great help. The wages was very low as he had to pay for his room and board at the "Finn Camp". The man who hired him asked him how he did in mathematics at high school. He said "I always made over 90%." THe man said why didn't you tell us. Jim said nobody asked me. Time went along and the war was on. Dad was meantime finding life very hard. So he asked Jim to ask his boss for a job, Jim rather laughed but he did and Philip got on working as a helper in the Power House. Jim was getting so he wanted to join up, all the young men were doing so. Well, he went to Montreal to try and get in the Air Force, then after the Army and lastly the Navy. The first two said he was underweight but the Navy took him. He was in training at Halifax, then in England. He was in the attacks in the Mediterranean and he got be an officer before the war was over. Meantime Philip had been in the Power House all this time. Jim and Tom, Doris' husband, both were married before they joined up. Tom could not go over-seas as his feet were not good. But he was kept at Montreal as an interpreter as he could speak French very well.

[On June12, 1943 their daughter, Marion, married Vic Cole, in Montreal and went on their honeymoon to Niagra Falls. Daisy and Philip accompanied them on their honeymoon.]

[In the summer of 1944,] Jim came home on a 6 weeks vacation and while he was home Philip had an operation for double hernia. He got through the operation all right but afterwards had a bad spell of a blood clot. Jim came for me to go to the hospital. He seemed to recover over that. Then he almost had pneumonia. He wanted to come home, so we asked the doctor and he said he would examine him Monday. Wednesday he came home in an ambulance. He was home nearly a week. The doctor said he could eat anything he liked and could do anything like getting up if he felt like it. [Around this time, Jim returned to Halifax.] Well, on the Sunday he had some visitors and Saturday he had gone to the bathroom and sat down in the living room for a minute. The next day after supper, I made him a nice dinner and asked him if he thought he could eat some apple pie. He said "Yes" and while I was making it, Peggie, my daughter-inlaw, came with her little girl [,Sally]. Philip called so she went to him and washed my hands from the pastry, then went in. He said for me to get him off the bed, but I said I would lift him up. He said to put some water on his head, which I did but then he said "It's no use, lay me down". And then by this time the doctor came in but he had passed away [at the age of 55]. I could not believe it was true. We took him to Cowansville to be [buried in the United Church cemetery] near his Uncle and Aunt. The rest of the family were all living there [in Montreal] then except Peggie. She came with me when we took Philip down [to Cowansville to be buried]. Jim was wired at Halifax that dad had gone and he met me at the station. We then had to take the train to Cowansville, where he[,Philip,] had been brought up, when he had come from England at 7 years. I met many old friends that day but we came back to Montreal in the evening.

I stayed with my daughter Hazel for nearly a month. Then a neighbour wrote and said that someone had stolen our radio and the shot-gun, so I decided to go back and sell most of the home except a few things to keep house in the summer months. It was very lonesome the first year, but after a year I got used to being without Philip. I spent the winters with Hazel for 7 years. Then she met her [future] husband [, Ralph HIBBARD] [.] While I was out west visiting Marion and Vic [COLE] she wrote and said she was getting married [in 1951]. So I hurried back and we sold the things we could not use except I kept my bed, table, radio, chair and dishes and rented a nice big room with a

Jewish family. I stayed there for 1 1/2 years I think [until around 1953. I took sick and Doris wrote and invited me to go and live with them so I did. I moved my bits of things up to Noranda. While living in Montreal folks had told me I should apply for the government pension for [persons aged] 65 years. So I did and got it for 5 years, then was eligible for [the] 70 year old pension. Tom Redmond, my son-in-law, was working as a Cage Tender at the mines. They [Tom and Doris] had 3 children.

While I was living with Hazel, Marion and Vic wrote and invited me to visit them in Buenos Aires, they could get me a free air trip. So I went down. It was my first air trip. It took about 4 days as we stayed at some place each night. We stopped at Trinidad which I thought was a lovely place. I liked the trip down very much and enjoyed my visit with Marion and Vic. I would not like to live there all the time but it sure was nice seeing all the different places and ways of the people. I used to go into the city to church every Sunday. I remember one time Marion said "Now you know how to ask for the ticket, Mum." You see you had to speak Spanish. Well I got to the station and offered a large size bill as I wanted change for the church collection. Well the station clerk said something to me in Spanish. I repeated the place I was going to. He pushed the money back and at last I caught on. He had not got change, so I gave him smaller money. The people in Buenos Aires seem quite different to Canadians. The children all wear white uniforms to school.I often wondered how the poor mothers got them washed and dried in the winter, which is quite often very damp and wet in the forenoon. We left to come home in July. Victor stayed awhile after we left, to sell the furniture. We had a good trip home, the plane hit an air pocket and dropped quite a few feet. Marion and [her son] David both were sick to their stomach as also were many of the passengers. I wasn't but it made my skin seem all tight, especially my face. We stayed in New York, then onto Montreal. We went to Church of Christ in the a.m. and at night, when I met brethren up from Seary, Arkansas, who knew Mrs. McKerlie. After we got back we stayed with Hazel awhile then to Noranda for Marion to wait till Vic came from Argentina. They then returned to Moose Jaw, his hometown, where he became a partner in a[n auto] repair parts store, and is still with his boy-hood friend [Earl NANT], which they have made into a good store, besides other stores.

I then lived with [my daughter] Hazel for 7 years, until Hazel got married to a brother in the church. She [now] has two sons and one girl. When Hazel got married at Sarnia, I rented a room with a Jewish family, stayed with them 1 1/2 years, then I sort of took sick and Doris suggested I live with them in Noranda, where I used to live on the farm in the summer time. I lived with Dot [Doris] and husband [Tom REDMOND] till he died suddenly [in 1959]. I went and spent a time with Margaret, then on to Hazel's. Since then, I spend time in each of their homes. [My son] Jim and Peggie live at Baie Commeau [, QC], their oldest girl [Sally] was married Mar 31, 1962, their little girl was born in December named Laura. After the wedding I spent two weeks with [my son,] Jim and [his wife] Peggie, had a very nice time. Peggie's mother died suddenly in 1962. I came [to Moose Jaw, SK] to visit [my daughter,] Marion and Vic [COLE] in December 1962 and expect to go to [my daughter] Margaret's [in St. Eustache, QC] for a visit then stay for [her daughter] Edith's wedding August 10, [1963] then back to Ontario in time for Hazel Redmond's (Doris' daughter's) wedding on August17 [,1963]. George, Lord Mountstephen (1829-1921) was tenant of Brocket Hall from 1892 until his death. He was President of the Bank of Montreal and first President of the Canadian Pacific Railway. He established the Ayot St. Peter and Lemsford Nursing Home, known as the Mountstephen Trust. The nursing home was closed and sold in 1952. The proceeds of sale were allocated as to two thirds to Lemsford and one third to Ayot St. Peter. On 26 March 1996 Ayot St. Peter PCC received the sum of ?6,689.41 following the winding-up of this charity.

Under his will dated 18 September 1934 the 1st Lord Brocket (who died just under nine weeks later on 21 November) left ?250 to the rector to be applied for the benefit of the poor of the parish of Ayot St. Peter. Like the two Charities of John Henry Peacock, Lord Brocket's Charity for the Poor still exists. It has registered number 258076 and at the beginning of 2000 it had assets totalling approximately ?225. It is proposed, during 2000, to wind up these three small charities (following the proper procedures laid down by the Charity Commission) and to remit their assets to Ayot St. Peter PCC.

An ancient homestead in the parish is Waterend. In the time of King John, Thebridge, now known as Waterend, was held by Viel de Thebridge, a free tenant of the abbot of St. Albans. The oldest extant document concerning Sandridge relates to Waterend, where in 1248 a conveyance of land was made. John Fitzsimon died in possession of a homestead and dovecote at Waterend in 1304. He rented the property from the nuns of Sopwell in St. Albans, from whence the supposed authoress of the famed "Boke of St. Albans" was reputed to hail. Fitzsimon paid partly in money and partly by aid to the abbot of St. Albans. The manor then remained in the possession of the Fitzsimon family for a hundred years. When in 1437 Elizabeth Fitzsimon married Thomas Brocket, the Brockets were to hold the manor until 1590. This family was prominent in the neighbourhood, as the memorials in Wheathampstead church testify. As happened to nearly all the land in the parish, the manor passed to the Jennings family. It is believed that the builder of the existing house was Sir John Jennings, who built it in 1610. It is the oldest existing house in the parish. It is a good example of an early seventeenth century red brick house on an E-shaped plan. There are two storeys and an attic with large moulded brick string courses between the storeys. The roof is tiled. The west front has three projecting

windows with stone mullions and transoms carried up to the attic, and above them are three steep, straight gables, with moulded coping. At the back are three large chimney stacks, with groups of octagonal shafts, which nave moulded bases and caps. The inside is now much altered, but in the kitchen there is a wide arched fireplace, and there is an original winding oak staircase of plain character.

The following notes compiled concerning William Gutteridge BRIMLEY (1786-1867) mention Daniel COLE and his son James W. COLE.

William left Huntingdon, Beds and went to work for a Mr. COLE [Daniel Cole(1820-1898)], a London business man who owned a farm [Chase farm] on the outskirts of Potters Bar. It seems more than a coincidence that the three of them went to live in the same district.

Mr Daniel COLE had a son [James W. COLE (1851-1923)] who became a tenant farmer at Water End, Wheathampstead, Herts. The property belonged to the Earl COWPER of Panshanger Park. (Welwyn Garden City now stands on the site and Panshanger Hall has been demolished.) William was offered a job there and moved to Water End where he went to lodge with. . . Maria CHANDLER, who was born at Cromer Hyde near Lemsford, Herts on 5th September 1857. The next note (by source DC0075 which is the England census 1871) does cite an Emma BRIMLEY living with Daniel COLE and Emma (Nee COLES) in 1871. This adds much credibility to these notes by source DC0167. Refer to a subsequent note by DCole (Source DC0001) where John BRIMLEY is the grandfather of William Gutteridge BRIMLEY (1786-1867) is also the great-grandfather of Daniel COLE (1814-1898). They do not share a common grandmother because John BRIMLEY (1715-1780) had two wives. The two wives of John BRIMLEY make Joseph BRIMLEY (b. 1760) the step-brother of Sarah BRIMLEY (1763-1788). If it were not for the two wives, Emma BRIMLEY (b. c 1842) would be a true niece of Daniel COLE (1814-1898).

I was intrigued by the Emma BRIMLEY who was living with Daniel COLE during the England Census of 1871. So I searched for a "direct" "niece" (of Daniel COLE) named Emma BRIMLEY. Taking "niece" to mean "daughter of a sibling", no Emma BRIMLEY was found to be a niece of Daniel COLE. In fact, the closest "niece" of any kind that I could find was the daughter of William BRIMLEY (b. 1817). The relationship is shown below (where "=" or "x" means marriage):

"Daniel COLE's grandmother Sarah BRIMLEY was the step-sister of Emily BRIMLEY's great-grandfather Joseph BRIMLEY". The step-sister relationship occurs because John BRIMLEY (1715-1780) was married to Ann HICKLEY in 1760 when son Joseph was born. John BRIMLEY (1715-1780) was married to Mary JONES in 1763 when daughter Sarah BRIMLEY was born. His gravestone lies outside the largest stained glass window. As you approach Selby Abbey from the main street in Selby, the gravestone is on the left hand side of the abbey. It lies approximately 75 feet to the left of the main left wall of the abbey.

The full text of the inscription on his gravestone is:

Sacred to the memory of Elizabeth Banks wife of James Banks Dishturner who departed this life the 8 day Dec 1810 aged 42 years. Also Sarah daughter of the above died 6 of September 1799 aged 1 year.

Reader take care for thou must shortly be Mouldering in the dust like me.

Also Mary Banks Wife of the Aforesaid James Banks who departed this life the 3 day of Dec 1852 aged 85 years. Also the above named James Banks of Selby who died August 10 1858 Aged 93 years.

His age, when he died, was either 92 or 93 as the two inscriptions (stained glass and gravestone) differ.

(I think that this means that Mary?, James BANK's second wife, is buried with him, not his daughter Mary Banks.)

The public can visit the stained glass window in Selby Abbey dedicated to James Banks. The stained glass window was erected to honour him by his sons on Easterday 1863 in Selby Abbey. This window is known as the Abraham window or the masons' window. This window is on the front portion of the left hand side of the church when facing the alter.

Yes, I have seen the headstone [on the grave of James Banks] in the Abbey grounds, the spooky thing is i've been cutting the grounds for the past seventeen years and not realized there were any relatives buried there.

The information I have gathered comes from the I.G.I LDS both from the internet and the 1881 microfiche cards, my great aunt and the two family documents which I've mentioned, census records of Selby 1841, 1851, and parish records of surrounding parishes of the City of York at the Borthwick Institute on Peasholme Green in York.

I have a photo copy of a page from the census of 1841 for Selby which has:

James Banks aged 75 of Bondgate

Mary Banks aged 70

William Banks aged 35 Timber M

Mary Colley aged 20

In the 1841 census it state's that any adult between the ages of 75-79 be written as 75 and 70-74 written as 70, 65-69 as 65 and so on.

Now William and Mary Colley married on the 1 Nov 1842 at St Mary's in Selby. In the parish records from Borthwick Ins it has William living in Barlby at the time which is just over the river and his father as James, and according to the I.G.Index they went on to have eight children all in Barlby. Have to confirm this with the parish records for Barlby.

In the 1851 census it states James Banks being 85 and born in Clifford and Mary being 86.

I will own up that I haven't made notes of record file number on parish records due to the fact I didn't think I'd find anyone connected with myself, but shall from now on.

.

Also I have to tell you of another James Banks living in Selby from the 1841 census. It states his age as 30 and a Woodturner and his wife is called Sarah and 25. In the 1851 census they are living at 56 Gowthorpe he's now 42 and was born in Bramham, Sarah is now 38 and she was born in Healaugh, no children stated.

This is causing concern with local information in the local library because any vague reference to James Banks or Woodturner and I'm not sure which one it is. I say this because in the Baines Directory of trades + professions the title comes under Turners in Wood, Ivory + Bone.

And in that directory for 1822 it has James Banks of Bondgate, Selby as the above, and in the 1837 it has James Banks Junior, Bondgate (dish, bowl, chair+shovel)

and also James Banks farmer Bondgate, Selby.

I've seen the headstone of James Banks in the Abbey grounds. I've been working on the two wife surnames, with the information i've got, His first wife may well be called ELIZABETH JENKINSON. She married a James Banks in the parish of Bramham on the 20th of September 1790 .The year before James Banks first child Mary was born.

The second wife still has some finding out to be done, but she could well be called :

MARY COLLEY, On the census returns for 1851 it has James' wife Mary being born at Flawith which is in the parish of Alne.

On the I.G.Index a James Banks married a Mary Colley on the 1st of February 1813 in the parish of Alne. and that's three years after his first wife Elizabeth died. and also i've mentioned William his son living with James on the 1841 census returns, his girlfriend and later wife, (who I believe lived at Cherry Orchard farm when they were married) was also called COLLEY and was also born at Flawith.

(there's a 66 year age gap between them) If you were wondering!) [I believe that Tony Fowler should have subtracted Mary's birth date from William's (not James) birth date. That would give an age difference of 17 years which is not unusual....D.Cole]

My records have Sarah being born 16/10/1797 with the info from the headstone stating she died on the 6/09/1799 it made her 1 year old.

In June 2001, I [David KC COLE] undertook a web-based "study" to determine where the people with the PECK surname were living in England, during the period 1500 to 1800. I was especially interested in Bedfordshire because a John PECK had a daughter who married John COLE in Bedfordshire, and in this manner, took his place among my ancestors. John COLE was born in Woburn, Beds. Sarah PECK was born in St. Pauls parish in Bedford, Beds. Sarah Peck married John COLE on the 5 Oct, 1755 in St. Pauls church in Bedford, Beds.

Today, WorldConnect [http://worldconnect.rootsweb.com/] lists over 60 million names, although it appears that US web-genealogists contribute more than British web-genealogists. To search World Connect, a given name and a surname must often be used. So, to begin with, I chose John PECK, because I felt that John was quite a common given name, through the ages. I came across many John PECKs in Yorkshire in the 1500's, but none in Bedfordshire until about 1814, specifically in Eaton Socon, Bedfordshire, England. His parents were William PECK (b. c1787) and Sarah? William PECK's father, Peter PECK (b. c1747) was also born in Bedfordshire. William's mother Mary PAGE married Peter PECK on 19 Jul 1779 in Eaton Socon, Bedfordshire. Mary PAGE's parents are unknown. Of 11 Peter PECKs in World Connect that were born between 1707 and 1747, 5 were either born or died in the USA and 1 was born in Bedford, England. No geographic information was provided for the other 5.

One of the earliest dated entries I found for a John PECK (b. 1279 Bolton, Yorkshire, England) was before 1300. But his pedigree dates back to an even earlier John PECK (b. c1126 Bolton, Yorkshire,d. c1149 Bolton, Yorkshire, England). He was married to an UNKNOWN Melgrave (b. c1129 in Yorkshire, England). One child is known to exist: Thomas PECK (B. c1150, Bolton, Yorkshire, England) The source is JohnHBoyd@compuserve.com. Of the 20-some PECK entries in his database, the most frequent given names are John (6), Robert (4), Thomas (4) and Richard (3). It was not easy to determine where these PECK's were born.

There is no clear indication that the PECK's from Bolton, Yorkshire were ancestors of the PECK's in Bedfordshire. The Bolton PECKs left no listed descendants after Richard PECK b. 1417 in Walkfield, Yorkshire, England) who died c1436.

Many other John PECKs were from Norfolk and Suffolk. For example Joseph PECK (b. bef 23 Aug 1623 in Hingham, Norfolk, England. He married Hannah (B. abt 1628 also in Hingham.) Records show one child Jathniel PECK (B. 24 Jul 1660 in Rehoboth, Bristol County, Massachusetts, USA. Their ancestors date back through Robert PECK (b. Bef 1508 in Beccles, England) and through Thomas PECK (b. ABT. 1394 in Yorkshire, England) and through John PECK (b. c1126 in Belton, Yorkshire) who is the earliest PECK in this line. Perhaps Belton is an alternate spelling of Bolton, Yorkshire, cited earlier above.

One line of Peck ancestors from Bedfordshire is spawned from Peter PECK who married Ann, and produced two children Robert PECK (Bb. c1715 in Biddenham, Bedfordshire) and Peter PECK (b. c1721 in the same location). Their descendants die out with William PECK (b. c1871 in Eaton Socon, Bedfordshire, England))

Nicholas PECK was a popular name in Hingham, Norfolk, in Wakefield, Yorkshire and in Beccles, Suffolk. Paul PECK was a popular name in Essex. Peter PECK was a popular name in Bedford. Richard PECK was a popular name everywhere in England. William PECK was a popular name in London more so than elsewhere.

Between 1780 and 1820, only 20 persons with PECK surnames are listed for England in World Connect. Eleven of

these are in Eaton Socon, Bedfordshire. But these 11 are all cited in the database named "rippin". Perhaps this provides a realistic conclusion:

"The perceived homes of the PECKs mentioned above is more an indication of who has been doing the research, rather than an indication of where all the PECKs lived in England."

The JOHN COLE (c1733-1764) to whom this note is attached) is the oldest known direct ancestor of the author of this database. There also is a second set of ancestors named COLE (or COLES or COALE) in this database. The two sets do not have a known common ancestor named COLE. The oldest person in the second set is named Thomas COLE (1739-1778). He has a son named John COLE (b. 1769) who is married to Mary MARSTIN (b. 1775). The first set of COLE ancestors is only connected to the second set by marriage, not by pedigree. But members of both sets of COLE ancestors were living in Hawnes, Beds., Eng. at the same time. The town of Hawnes is sometimes

spelled as Haynes. Both sets were probably members of the same church (St. Mary's church) in Hawnes. A stroll through the cemetary at St. Mary's church will produce many gravestrone inscriptions with a variant of the surname COLE. There is a high probability that the two sets of COLE families are related but the actual relationship is unknown, if it indeed exists.

The connection between the two sets of COLE families is quite complex, but it can be described as follows. Let us begin with the COLE family that is not related to the author:

- 1) Thomas COLE (1739-1778) has a son James COLES (b.c1769). It is unknown where Thomas COLE (1739-1778) lived. In the IGI batch M003921, there is a Thomas COAL residing at Maulden Beds., Eng.
- 2) James COLES (b.c1769) and his wife Mary MARSTIN (b.1775) lived in Haynes, Beds., Eng.
- 3) James COLES (b.c1769) is an ancestor of Alvin COLES (5 Jan 1880).
- 4) Alvin COLES (b. 5 Jan 1880) married Mary Ida FOGG (b. 15 Feb 1879).
- 5) Mary Ida FOGG (b.15 Feb 1879) is a descendant of Mehitable SANBORNE (b. c1645). Mehitable's surname and given name are spelled different ways in different family trees, eg Mehetabel SAMBORN or Mehitable SANBORN.
- 6) Mehitable SANBORN (b. c1645) is a descendant of Nicolas SAMBORN (b.1455). Note that Mary Ida FOGG (b. 15 Feb 1879) is also a descendant of Nicolas SAMBORN (b. 1455).
- 7) A son of Nicolas SAMBORN (b.1455) is John SAMBORNE (b.1481)
- 8) John SAMBORNE (b.1481) married Dorothy TICHBORNE (1503-1572).
- 9) A grandfather of Dorothy TICHBORNE (1503-1572) is Robert WHITE (b.1455).
- 10) The 16th grand-daughter of Robert WHITE (b. 1455) is Yvette RICHARD (b.1944).
- 11) Yvette RICHARD (b. 1944) is married to David KC COLE (b. 1944).
- 12) An ancestor of David KC COLE (b. 1944) is Daniel COLE (1814-1898)
- 13) Daniel COLE (1814-1898) and his wife Emma nee COLES (1821-1913) lived in Haynes, Beds., Eng. Daniel COLE (1814-1898) and his wife Emma nee COLES (1821-1913) both have the same great-grandfather John COLE (c1733-1764). NAME SYNTAX / PRESENTATION used by the Author

Most names in this database have the given names in lower case and the surnames in Upper Case. The following exceptions exist.

Primary Names and Alternate Spellings of Names

This database has been adjusted so that the reader can easily distinguish the "Primary Name" of a person from an "Alias Name" or alternate spellings of names. The "Primary Name" of a person is the spelling of the name that the author believes to be the most probable or the way the person would have preferred to spell it. The "Primary Name" of a person has the surname in upper case. The "Primary Name" usually has the given name in lower case (with the first letter in capitals). Other alternate spellings of names of persons have the surname in lower case. Do NOT create a separate person for each name.

If a person's name can be spelt in more than one way, DO NOT do the following:

Do NOT include both spellings in place of the surname

- 1) Do NOT enter as "Peter or SCHMIDT Do NOT enter it as "Peter SMITH/SCHMIDT"
- 3) Do NOT enter it as two separate persons
 - eg "Peter SMITH" and "Peter SCHMIDT"
- 4) Do NOT enter "AKA" as part of the sur name
 - eg "Peter SMITH aka SCHMIDT"

Instead, enter two separate Facts for the same individual

- eg Fact Name 1 "Peter SMITH" flagged as "primary"
- & Fact Name 2 "Peter Schmidt"

The surnames in the second (and third etc) names should appear in lower case to distinguish

Direct Ancestors

This database has been slightly adjusted so that the reader can easily determine the individuals that are direct ancestors

of the author (DAVID KC COLE) or his children or his wife. All direct ancestors of the author have their first given name spelled in upper case (i.e. capital letters). For example, the person for whom these notes are written is named "JOHN COLE". When examining the name index, most persons named "John COLE" have their first given name printed in lower case. Middle given names will appear in lower case.

Initials and Nick-Names

Initials that represent abbreviations of given names are not usually followed by periods.

Nick-names are entered following the first given name and are presented within parentheses. For example "CHARLES (Charley) Percy COLE".

Compound Surnames

Surnames that include a space have the surname delimited by " (back-slashes). For example: "Baron ST. CASTIN surnames such as "McEwen" or "DeLaMare" are not completely converted to upper case. They appear as "McEWEN" and "DeLaMARE".

Titled Persons

Titles are entered in the Lineage screen in Family Tree Maker. For example: the name would be entered as "Tom Jones" not "Rev. Tom Jones." The "Rev" would be entered in the Lineage Screen when using Family Tree Maker software.

DIT names

French Canadian "DIT" names are usually treated as if the "DIT name" were a nick-name. For example "ALEXANDRE (DIT Boutin) RICHARD"

Royalty

Names of kings do not include a surname, but instead the title such as "King of England" is usually entered instead of the surname. For example: "William I (the Conqueror) of England ID Code or Reference Number for an individual When an individual is entered into the database using the FTM software, the software automatically assigns a numeric name code prefaced by the letter "I". This code is called the Individual ID Code. The Individual ID Code for the author, David COLE, is "I00345". This results in the following record in the GEDCOM file "0 @I00345@ INDI", followed by a record defining the name of the individual. When using FTM software, the author of the database can also define a Reference Number for any individual. This is done in the Lineage screen by clicking on the Lineage button located to the right of the Notes about an individual. A Reference Number of 345 results in the following record in the GEDCOM file "1 REFN 345". In this case the Reference Number agrees with the numeric part of the Individual Name Code. But the Reference Number can be completely different from the numeric part of the Individual Name Code.

UID Code

Some genealogy software generates a unique individual code called the "UID". These UID codes can be seen when information about an individual is viewed on the WorldConnect web site.

PostEm Notes

The Individual Name Code has a special use when the GEDCOM is uploaded to the WorldConnect site. Any member of the public can attach a POST-M note to the information about any individual in the WorldConnect site. The note can be a test message and can contain a hypertext link to a photograph that appears anywhere on the Web. The author of the database can see a list of all of the POST-M notes that have ever been attached to his database. This is a (slow) method of communicating with the author of the database. The author can decide to include any or all of the text in the database.

Unknown Parents

When the name of only one parent is known, the unknown parent is unnamed unless the wedding date is known. If the wedding date is known, it should be included and the name of the unknown parent is entered as "??". If two men are known to be brothers, but no information about their parents is known, one parent should be entered as "??" and the second parent should not be defined at all.

If the names of both parents are unknown for an individual with no known siblings, the parents should not be defined at all.

If all given names are unknown but the surname is known, the unknown name should be represented by a "?". For example: "? ADAMS" should be the result.

If a given name is known but the surname is unknown, the unknown name should be represented by a "?". For example: "Ann?" should be the result.

Amerinds

If it is desired to indicate that a person has some "Amerind" blood, this should be indicated by the word "Indian" between parentheses as if it were another Nick-Name. For Example: "Catherine (Indian) AMBROISE".

Twins

If it is desired to indicate that two children are twins, the word "twin" should be included in parentheses as if it were a nickname. For francophones the french equivalent can be used e.g. (jumeau).

Eliminate Islands of Persons

Every person in the database should be related to every other person either by blood or by marriage. No "islands" of names should exist. Only one exception is permitted. The exception is "Person Unrelated) This "special person" exists so that it can be selected as a "simple test" to see how many generations are included in reports. This is necessary for Family Tree Maker because the user cannot control the number of generations that are to be included in any report before the report is requested. The problem occurs when a huge report is accidentally requested. Such reports sometimes cannot be aborted with some software packages.

Unknown Groups of Children

To represent unnamed or unknown children, simply write "children3" or "siblings2" or "daughters4" or "son" or "daughter". If the number of persons is known the number should be included as a suffix, as shown in the previous examples. This can also be done as a reminder to come back and enter the names of all the children when you have time to do it well.

Related vs Unrelated Persons

When some confusion exists about whether "John SMITH" is related to the author (or not), include the word "unrelated" after the given name. For example write "John COLE" if the person has a common direct ancestor with the author of the database. But write "John (unrelated) COLE" if it is important to note that the person does not have a common direct ancestor with the author.

Roman Catholic religious names

A Roman Catholic (or any) person's official name on the birth certificate or baptismal certificate might be "Marie-Louise Yvette Richard". In this case, if the familiar name is "Yvette", then the name should be entered into a genealogy database as "Yvette M-Louise RICHARD". It will then be sorted and presented correctly. For example, if the name must be abbreviated to fit in a box on a chart, the result might be "Yvette RICHARD". The official name might have resulted in "Marie-Louise RICHARD". An official male name of "Joseph-Elphege Jacques Richard" should be converted into "Jacques J-Elphege RICHARD" for use in the database.

Temporary Names

Occasionally it may be necessary to temporarily indicate that a woman of many that are named "Jane White" is married to one of many men named "J Smith". To "tag" the exact "Jane White", temporarily change her name to "Jane mJSmith White" until the confusion is eliminated. The "m" means "married to".

Similarly, to tag a person with their father's name, temporarily change the name to include the father's name. For example "John aPeter Thompson". This means the "John Thompson" whose father is named "Peter". In the Acadian world where duplicate names often exist, they commonly say "Jean a Pierre a Simon RICHARD". It means "Jean who is the son of Pierre who is the son of Simon RICHARD".

Questionable Individuals

Two sources sometimes disagree about whether a person in the family tree should be included or not. This happens most often concerning the oldest ancestors in any branch of a family tree. In this case I include two capital Xs, like this XX as one of the given names in the primary name for the individual. I also cite both sources (the source that provides the information and the source that disagrees).

Naming a Baby

The first baby in a family or the first male baby is often assigned a middle name that is the same as the mother's maiden surname. For example "" if the mother's maiden name is "Charlotte Rowe STRUTT", the first baby might be named "Suzan Strutt GODWIN". This indicates pride in the marriage of the two families. It also provides a clue as to the mother's maiden name in societies where the wife changes her surname into her husband's surname. This clue is sometimes necessary when genealogists are searching for the mother's maiden surname.

Names on Tombstones

The wife's name on a Tombstone should always include her maiden name and her married name if the two differ. For example, if "Charlotte Rowe STRUTT" changed her name when she married "John GODWIN", the tombstone would read

"John GODWIN"
1905-1960
His Wife
"Charlotte Rowe GODWIN"
(nee STRUTT)
1910-1975
```

As shown, a date range is preferable to "Died Age 65, Born 1910". Also, future searchers might need to know that Charlotte was his wife, not his daughter.

Consider the following tombstone engraving seen at Selby Abbey, Selby, Yorkshire, Eng.

Sacred to the memory of Elizabeth Banks wife of James Banks Dishturner who departed this life the 8 day Dec 1810 aged 42 years. Also Sarah daughter of the above died 6 of September 1799 aged 1 year.

Reader take care for thou must shortly be Mouldering in the dust like me.

It says a lot but ... it also leaves some things unsaid.

Validation

To see how the FTM software will treat any person's name that you enter, simply look up the person in the person pick-list (i.e. person index).

Matches to people in other databases Is there a connection between.....and.....?

Often one asks if two persons (referenced in two different sources) are the same person. If 5 or 6 facts agree, the probability of a match is very high.

For example

James K. BANKS 1765-1858

Born in: Selby, Yorkshire, Eng.

Died: August 10, 1858

Father: William BANKS

Wife: Mary nee SMITH

If 5 of these facts agree and none or one is absent, the match is very probable.

If a single contradiction exists, a non-match is extremely probable.

This genealogy database has also been uploaded to the www.GenCircles.com site. This site automatically compares each individual in each database to all the individuals in all of the other databases. It does this with a very high degree of accuracy. When an individual is viewed on the GenCircles site, the number of matches in other databases is shown in the top-right-hand corner of the window. For a small fee (such as \$30/annum), each pair of matches can be viewed in detail.
